Programme Highlights

- In our **Palna Weekids programm**e, the graduation from pre-school to kindergarten was a highpoint! 233 eligible children got enrolled in school, and another 60 are on wait-list for July.
- Thriving through the **Vocational Training Programme**, our girls excelled in Beauty Culture, Sewing & Tailoring, and Computer Graphics courses. During this quarter 93 girls successfully cleared their National Skill Development Council examination and passed out with A grade.
- **Educational Sponsorship** saw 568 children collect their stipends and stationery. The turnout was lower than usual as annual board exams and school exams were on. Parents informed that they will collect during the next disbursement, along with all necessary the documents.
- **Bal Chetna children** from Janakpuri Centre showcased their talent and stole hearts at an event hosted by Concern India Foundation, supported by Brown-Forman and organised by Secure Giving. Heartfelt thanks to the organisers and kudos to our trio of Prasoon, Reena, and Sonvi for their dedication.
- We started a **new centre at Shahbad Dairy** in January, with Palna WeeKids, Supervised Homework Scheme and Vocational training in Beauty culture and Tailoring.

- The Manzil Mystics Organisation conducted sessions at DCCW centres focusing on **women's empowerment.**
- Lohri, Holi, and Republic Day were celebrated at all centres with great enthusiasm and fervour!

Other Updates

Visit to Prem Dham Ashram: A team from Palna led by the Director, Ms Neeru Bhatnagar, had an uplifting experience at Prem Dham Ashram in Bijnor, a rehabilitation home for destitute, mentally and physically challenged young adults and senior citizens. Over the years several of our special needs children have found a safe haven here as they grew older and needed to be transferred from Palna. Our team was welcomed graciously by Father Shibu and Father Linto, and we witnessed a soul-stirring event featuring the musical talents of the residents. Our special educators, communicating through sign language, made connections that went beyond words. enriching experience filled our hearts
