But somewhere at the back of her mind there was always a desire to reconnect with her birth country and the place that had been her home there, for however brief a time.


She finally found her way back to Palna, 44 years after she had left! Rakhee and her husband visited Palna in November. This was their first visit to India. Like every Palna child coming home, she was received with great warmth and affection. Loraine Campos, Assistant Director, Palna, who has been with DCCW for more than three decades, showed Rakhee her file her time at Palna as she gleaned details of her past and re-lived that time through photographs.

Loraine also took them around Palna so that they could see for themselves how the children lived and were cared for. The experience gave Rakhee a sense of peace - and the closure that she had been subconsciously seeking all these years.


