We are delighted to announce the opening of our latest Computer Training Unit under our Vocational training Programme at our Qudsia Bagh premises.

With a former student of ours, Ritika, taking on the reins as the instructor, we are expanding our reach in this area to offer computer graphics and animation courses to empower underprivileged girls in the age group of 14 to 21 years. In the three months since it was started, the centre has picked up very well and reaching out to 30 beneficiaries.

We express our deepest gratitude to **Mr. Ramit Budhraja** for generously donating all the equipment and infrastructure for this course in memory of his late parents Lt. Gen. Lok Nath and Mrs Raj Budhraja. The centre was inaugurated in April by Ms. Meenaxi Gupta, our esteemed board member who has been associated with DCCW for the last four decades.

The **new centre at Shahbad Dairy** in Northwest Delhi that was started last quarter, is now running at full strength. Our programmes Palna WeeKids, Supervised Homework Scheme and Vocational training run from that centre and we now have 45 beneficiaries using the services of the centre every day.

We hope to impact more lives and stay dedicated to our mission of 'Giving children a childhood and a future'.






Spotlight: Sunanda

Programme Highlights

Summer camps were organised across **DCCW centres**. The kids had a rollercoaster of activities including brain games, team building, computer classes, yoga, and Zumba. Every moment was packed with excitement and creativity, making each day a new adventure.

A **two-day instructor workshop** was conducted with **Palna WeeKids** instructors by Ms Sunita Sharma, an expert trainer in Early Childhood Care and Education. The focus was on effective communication techniques, language development and story-telling methods. It was an enlightening and enjoyable experience for everyone.

Educational Sponsorship: In April, 610 students benefited from our educational sponsorship program, receiving both financial aid and stationery gift hampers. Our counselling sessions focused on fostering effective study schedules, time management skills, stress management techniques, and leveraging online study resources. Additionally, students were motivated to develop their personality and professional skills.

Six students from our **Supervised Homework Scheme and Vocational Training programme**, New Seemapuri centre, along with two instructors, attended the 39th National Learn to Live Together Camp held in Mohali, Chandigarh, from 23rd-29th June 2024. This enriching event brought children from across India together to share traditions and enjoy creative activities, games, sports, and insightful lectures tailored for adolescents. Our students **Mansi and Tanisha each won a gold medal** in creative collage making and Kathak dance respectively.

Two beneficiaries of our Vocational Training programme in Computers have been **appointed by EXL**. This achievement is a testament to their talent and perseverance. The girls enrolled at our vocational training program at Qudsia Bagh were given a session on female reproductive health and menstruation by volunteers from Manzil Mystics.

Mother's Day was celebrated across our DCCW centres. From heartwarming performances to exciting games and prizes, every moment was a tribute to maternal love. Children and teachers crafted memories in handmade frames and penned love in every Mother's Day card.

One memorable morning the Palna crew boogied with an electrifying Zumba session by the group of **Synergy Institute of Music**. With peppy Bollywood beats, the Palna team, Palna kids, and Palna WeeKids swayed and grooved, soaking in the energy!

The team of **Soul Setu Wellness Foundation** joined hands with Palna to give us a one-of-a-kind experience of a sound healing therapy session.
